 - There were no signs of pack rats in the Cabin, however, we did spot a hole in the side of the building leading to the cellar. Bob found a scrap of wood and nailed it over the hole.
 - I resecured the metal screens on the outside of the windows as some of them were loose.
 - Bob put up some more orange tape and wood to mark where he wants the picnic table to be placed when Ernie gets it done. The old tape he had put up was gone.
 - I clipped the old Princeton postcard donated by Roy Roberts, to the wire on the antique washboard inside the Cabin, that I use to display things. Thank you, Roy for your donation!!
 - The front door is beginning to really stick. Possibly the Cabin is settling. It will need to be addressed next year.

- Bob and I walked the old Granite Creek wagon road to where the water supply for the Cabin started (not hooked up anymore) and Bob took GPS coordinates. We now have GPS data for the wagon road from the clearcut “Y” where the sign is, all the way down to the end where it stops at a rockslide.

- This year we have put out 600 maps in the mailbox at the Granite Creek Town Site.
